Voting in Coconino County-Safe, Secure, Trusted

Steps we take to ensure your vote counts:

SAFETY AND SECURITY designed into every step, from voter registration, early voting and election day boards to tabulation and final canvassing of results.

EVERY FUNCTION and responsibility separated and protected by layers of checks and balances.

PHYSICAL SAFEGUARDS that control access to equipment and/or ballots also detect tampering or malicious activity.

PROTECTIONS include elections personnel background checks, building keypad access, 24-7 closed-circuit camera systems, and chains of custody seals and locks.

BALLOTS ARE REGULARLY RETRIEVED from secured drop boxes by at least two people of opposite political parties, with logs and seals audited and retained.

QUALIFIED, CERTIFIED STAFF verify each mailed or dropped-off ballot signature against the voter registration file to guarantee only legitimate votes.

How to Register to Vote or Update Your Registration

ONLINE www.ServiceArizona.com You must have an Arizona Driver License or Identification Card.

PRINT a voter registration form from the Coconino County Elections website: www.coconino.az.gov/elections.

CALL THE RECORDER'S OFFICE

to have a form mailed to you: (928) 679-7860 or (800) 793-6181.

IN PERSON VISIT any registration office listed on the back of this mailer.

You must update your voter registration when your home address, name or political party preference changes. Election mail is not forwardable. It's important to keep your mailing address current even if you are only temporarily away.



Only voters with a party preference of Democratic or Republican are eligible to vote in the Presidential Preference Election (PPE).

If you wish to change your party to vote in the PPE you must update your registration no later than Tuesday, February 20, 2024.

If you are listed as an Active Early

Voter, you will automatically receive a ballot by mail approximately three weeks before each election in which you are eligible to vote. If you wish to be removed from the Active Early Voter List please contact the Recorder's Office.

If you are NOT an Active Early Voter,

you will receive a sample ballot before each election notifying you where you may vote for that election.

Please note that your Board of Supervisors District may have changed due to redistricting.

General Election November 5

March 19, 2024 Presidential Preference Election (PPE)

Only registered voters with a political party preference of Democratic or Republican are eligible to vote in the PPE. If your party preference is Green, Libertarian, No Labels, Independent, Party Not Designated, or Other Party, you are not eligible to vote in the PPE.

If you wish to change your party in order to vote in this election, you must update your registration no later than Tuesday, February 20, 2024.

August 6, 2024 ★ Primary Election

Voters registered with a recognized political party may only vote that party's ballot. Democratic, Republican, Libertarian, No Labels, Green - you vote your party's ballot.

Voters who are not registered with a recognized political party or registered as Independent may choose a Democratic or Republican ballot. The No Labels Party has not indicated at the time of this mailing if their primary will allow unaffiliated voters to participate.

AEVL voters who are not registered with a recognized political party must let the Recorder's Office know which ballot they want to receive. If a ballot choice is not specified, then one will not be mailed.

The easiest way to choose a ballot is to complete the notice we will mail to you in May.

EARLY VOTING OPTIONS

Active Early Voting List (AEVL)

Any registered voter with a mailing address within Arizona may request to be placed on the Active Early Voter List (AEVL).

Voters on the AEVL will automatically receive an early ballot by mail for all elections in which they are eligible to participate.

Request an Early Ballot

Voters who are not on the AEVL may request an early ballot to be mailed to them up to 11 days before an election.

An early ballot can be requested through our website, by phone, or in writing.

Vote Early In Person

Voters may vote early in person up until the Friday before an election.

Early voting is available at the Coconino County Recorder's Office as well as several other sites within the county. Please call for more information or visit our website for a complete list of early voting sites.

Returning Your Early Ballot

There are several ways to return your early ballot:

Mail: We recommend to mail your ballot no later than 7 days prior to Election Day to ensure it is received by the deadline.

Drop off: Drop your ballot in an official ballot drop box.

Deliver it: Take your ballot in person to any early voting location. A list of drop boxes and early voting locations will be provided with your early ballot and posted on our website prior to each election.

Sign, Seal, Deliver!

In order for your ballot to be valid and counted, it must be sealed and placed in the signed affidavit envelope. This must be delivered to the Coconino County Recorder's Office, to a polling place, or official drop box in the County no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day.
